Sir,

As you are aware, Chief Mike Hill has requested a deviation from the standard dispatch protocol for incidents that take place on Interstate 95. The CCFCA Communications Committee believes that in the best interest of public safety, Chief Hill has demonstrated adequate justification for this request and has uncovered a flaw in using AVL to dispatch emergency resources along this section of our county. After discussing this situation with the 10-members of the communications committee, we agree and fully indorse the following changes to take place immediately:

- For incidents that take place on I-95, disable AVL and use the pre-planned geo-proximity zone cards for emergency resource response.
- The CCFCA Communications Committee recommends geo-proximity dispatching for I-95 incidents only, at this time.
- The committee with the assistance of the CCES Communications Manager will monitor this situation and may make further recommendations regarding this matter in the future.
